Vernacular names are often given in Portuguese, French, English and German as well. Interesting etymological analyses of the Latin names are frequently given. A descrip-

tion of the plant is followed by notes on the habitat, flowering period and uses (if any). There is an excellent bibliography of 21 pages followed by a page of clever symbols signifying uses, and this is supported by a very complete and detailed page index of the uses of plants, occupying 80 pages. It is not usual to find such a local economic botanical book with so much

information so easily available.
